DECLARACIÓN JURADA DE: DR. MARCEL ALEXANDER ARMAND VAN DRUNICK

This is to certify that I, Doctor Marcel Alexander Armand van Drunick have on this 28 July 2019 to declare as follows:

I am 57 years old male, employed by Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines as a medical doctor (since July 22, 2018). I have been a doctor for 33 years, (qualified in 1986). I was in private practice since then.

My qualifications are MBCHB (medical degree) 1986, MBA (1999), Diploma Occupational Health (200) Advance Diploma in Aesthetic Medicine (2016).

On the 7th July 2019, I signed on to Freedom of the Seas at 9:00 a.m. (transfer from hotel).

I attended the predeparture safety lecture at 3:00 p.m. I met the Dr. Bruno N. da Sousa there at 3:40 p.m. The clinic starts at 4:00 p.m. and I suggested that I go downstairs to the clinic to help with seeing patients (Dr. Bruno still had to give a lecture). At 4:00 p.m. I was

in the medical clinic at work 4:04 p.m., the radio started calling for an emergency. The attending nurse Natalia Acosta responded immediately, took the emergency trolley bag and I

ran after her, hearing that there was an "accident" on the gangway. We (nurse Natalia) and myself ran down the gangway and about halfway down the pier we saw the body of a baby


lying on the pier. It was a female, 18 month baby lying face down with multiple traumatic injuries. There was no life, (open skull), fracture brain tissue over pier). Her one pink shoe

and the white hat was lying on the pier not far from the deceased. I immediately shouted for a sheet to cover the body (was brought with in 1-2 minutes). By then Dr. Bruno da Souza

had also arrived on the scene. There was no one else there at that time. I started looking around the scene and everything was quiet. I looked up, and saw passengers pointing

upwards towards deck 11/12 they were about 3 decks lower). Then I heard some screaming. I informed Dr. Bruno that he should stay on the scene and myself and nurse Natalia should

attend to the family (as they were going to need assistance). We ran back on to the ship and took the elevator (prioritize) emergency route straight to deck (11). When the doors opened



on deck 11 there was chaos outside. The grandfather was being escorted (assisted on both sides, from other people), crying and sobbing, I stepped out the elevator and immediately helped him into the elevator. The nurse and some security people were with me. The doors closed and we went down. The grandfather collapsed on this hands an knees, with his head in the corner of the elevator. He was distraught sobbing crying saying: " I dropped my baby, I dropped my baby". I bent down and asked him what happend. While he was crying he just said: " I thought the window was closed". We got down to level 1 and took him to the clinic and the emergency room. His wife was with him. I offered to give him a sedative but he refused. His wife also refused sedative. By then the mother and father arrived (by security) and entered the clinic at reception. The parents were both emotionally traumatized, asking to see their child. The parents were kept separated from the ER/Grandfahter. The father declined any sedative. So also the mother. Later on the other family members also arrived, also the son (was kept in one office-played on his phone, and was assited by Michael (CTA-Care Team Associate). After about half an hour the mother accepted the sedative (Alprazolam 1mg) by mouth and also received a sedative injection into arm. I walked around cheking on all family members a grandmother "Mary" also accepted an Alprazolam sedative. By then (after about one hour) the grandfather "Sam" was sitting outside the emergency room on the floor, assisted by another CTA and his wife. Later he was sitting in one of the ward-rooms on the chairs, having calmed down but bursting into tears everytime anyone spoke to him. He had no sedative. The family were in the medical facility for about 4 hours, until they were disembarked to a local hotel. The person who identified himself, to me as "Sam", I later saw on the Esea.care System his full name was Salvatore Anello, accompanied with a photograph on the ship computer system, and I confirm that "Sam" and Salvatore Anello, to be one and the same person. That is all I have to declare.
